


## Pupil Premium Strategy

### Compton All Saints' Primary School 2017-18

From April 2012 all schools have received funding known as Pupil Premium (PPG). This funding is given to support the achievement of pupils in school who are in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM). (This is not connected to the free school meals scheme for KS1 pupils). It is a major concern that children who come from low income families are at a greater risk of underperforming compared to children from families with higher incomes. The school also receives Service Children Premium (SCP) for children of Service personnel and funding for Looked after Children (LAC) and children who were previously in receipt of free school meals (Ever 6).


We track the progress of our children as part of our termly 'Pupil Progress' meetings where we consider the historical and current progress of each child. The monitoring process identifies Pupil Premium children who are under performing or require support with their emotional and social development. The school's Inclusion Manager works closely with teachers and learning support assistants to explore the barriers to learning and ways in which they can be overcome. Intervention programmes and support can vary considerably depending on the child. Some activities with cost implications may be subsidised or paid for using the PPG funding, this provides opportunities for children who may otherwise be unable to take part. Impact will be measured through observations, pre and post evaluations of interventions such as ELSA, analysis of attainment data and discussions with staff, parents and pupils.



## Our Principles

We continually strive to ensure that learning and teaching opportunities meet the needs of all our pupils. Our ambition is to ensure that barriers to learning are overcome, appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups and that the needs of disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed. To this end the school uses a broad range of measures to decide which pupils should benefit from support from the Pupil Premium Grants. The Pupil Premium strategy, attainment data, website information for parents and interventions and their impact are reviewed annually in the autumn term by the Head Teacher, Inclusion Manager and governor responsible for PPG.

## Provision



**We recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged and that not all pupils who are disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We therefore reserve the right to allocate PPG funding to support a wider range of pupils who have been legitimately identified as needing additional support to achieve outcomes in their learning and/or well-being. The target group who receive support from PPG funding is subject to continual scrutiny by the Head Teacher and Governors of Compton Primary School.**
