Job/Person Summary

Compton All Saints' is offering an opportunity for an enthusiastic and caring person to join our school team from September 2018. The role will involve one-to-one support for a child in Upper Key Stage 2.

The post is part of a split role so that ideas and expertise can be regularly shared between the successful candidate and a second SNA. Sharing strategies and expertise is a key component of the role. The candidate will preferably have experience of managing pupils with additional needs including social and emotional difficulties, ADHD or autistic spectrum.

The LSA team at Compton All Saints' is highly skilled, dedicated and lots of fun so the successful candidate will have plenty of support in a happy environment. The post is for the 2018/19 academic year, in the first instance, to tie-in with the process of annual review.

For candidates with an ELSA qualification there may be opportunities for additional hours to fit around the SNA role. Please see our separate advert for this role for up to 10 hours/week.
