

## Literacy

Over these last weeks of the school year the children will be applying their learning to a variety of writing tasks, building their writing stamina and improving their editing skills.

### **Yr 1**

- Use the prefix *un-* in their writing.
- Practise handwriting looking at letters which belong to same handwriting 'families'.

### **Yr 2**

- Add suffixes to spell some words correctly in writing. (e.g. -ment, -less, -full, -ly and -ness.)
- Practise joining letters in handwriting.

**Fiction** - Handa's Surprise and other African based stories.

**Non-Fiction** - Texts about African wildlife.

## Art

- Take inspiration from African art and textiles to study pattern and colour.
- Design and make own print block and use to make a repeating pattern.
- Experiment using PVA glue to create Batik.
- Look at animal markings and camouflage.

## Design and Technology

- Investigate simple mechanisms made from card and paper to make a picture with moving parts.
- Plan, make and evaluate a fruit kebab thinking about product design and appearance.

## Numeracy

Over this last half term the children will be revisiting topics and applying their maths knowledge to solving problems and completing projects in the classroom and wherever possible outside.
